| Always assume the patient is already registered in APM. The patient may not recognize or remember that they have been to an ETSU Health Clinic, or the patient could've been registered with us for hospital charges. 1. Open the Registration tab and look for the binoculars icon. 2. Patient provided the following demographics: DOB 01/01/2000, First Name: Catwoman, Last Name: Test | | |
| 3. | Only look for one piece of data (information) at a time— <u>APM</u> will look at all the boxes at the same time! For example: If you search for DOB 01/01/2000 AND Patient Name "te,ca", it will not return any results.
