Continuation of HCC 107 Vascular Disease with Complications:

Instead of	RAF: 0.000
187.2	Venous insufficiency (chronic) (peripheral)
I83.0	Varicose veins of lower extremities with ulcer
183.2	Varicose veins of lower extremities with both ulcer and inflammation
Consider (when clinically rele	evant) RAF: 0.383
I87.311	Chronic venous hypertension (idiopathic) with ulcer of right lower extremity
6th character -2 (I87.312)	- left lower extremity
6th character -3 (I87.313)	- bilateral lower extremity
187.331	Chronic venous hypertension (idiopathic) with ulcer and inflammation of right lower extremity
	- identify other extremity using I87.33- and the appropriate 6th character based on location
I83.011	Varicose veins of right lower extremity with ulcer of thigh
6th character -2 (I83.012)	- ulcer of calf
6th character -3 (I83.013)	- ulcer of ankle
6th character -4 (I83.014)	- ulcer of heel and midfoot
6th character -5 (I83.015)	- ulcer of other part of foot
6th character -8 (I83.018)	- ulcer of other part of lower leg
I83.021	Varicose veins of left lower extremity with ulcer of thigh
	- identify other ulcer site using I83.02- and the appropriate 6th character based on location
183.211	Varicose veins of right lower extremity with both ulcer of thigh and inflammation
	- identify other ulcer site using I83.21- and the appropriate 6th character based on location
I83.221	Varicose veins of left lower extremity with both ulcer of thigh and inflammation
	- identify other ulcer site using I83.22- and the appropriate 6th character based on location

Important Note: Treatment of PVD/PAD should include appropriate documentation of medications, such as statin therapy, clopidogrel, or aspirin.

• If a patient is being prescribed a statin or clopidogrel, you could also report:

Z79.02 - Long term (current) use of antithrombotics/antiplatelets

• If a patient is being prescribed aspirin, you could also report:

Z79.82 - Long term (current) use of aspirin
