



Diabetes Care Quality Measures

Eligible Population: **Patients ages 18-75 with type 1 or type 2 diabetes**

- Exclusions for the Diabetes Care Measures: hospice/palliative care; PCOS; gestational or steroid-induced diabetes; age ≥ 66 living long-term in an institution; age ≥ 66 with advanced illness and frailty diagnoses.



Hemoglobin A1C Control for Patients with Diabetes

Eligible patients will need their most recent HbA1c in the current measurement year to be $\leq 8\%$.

Eye Exam for Patients with Diabetes

Eligible patients will need a retinal or dilated eye exam performed by an eye care professional during the current measurement year.

- If a retinal or dilated eye exam that was *negative* for diabetic retinopathy was performed in the prior measurement year, this will also count for compliance.

Medical Attention for Nephropathy

Eligible patients will need any one of the following during the current measurement year:

- Nephropathy screening or monitoring test for albumin or protein, such as:
 - 24-hour urine/timed/spot urine for albumin, protein or total protein
 - Urine for albumin/creatinine ratio
 - Random urine for protein/creatinine ratio
- Angiotensin converting enzyme inhibitor or angiotensin receptor blocker (ACE/ARB) therapy or dispensed medication
- Evidence of or treatment for any of the following conditions:
 - Diabetic nephropathy or kidney transplant
 - End-stage renal disease (ESRD), chronic renal failure (CRF) or chronic kidney disease (CKD)
- A visit with a nephrologist



In 2023, this measure will be transitioned to a more comprehensive Kidney Health Evaluation for Patients with Diabetes (KED) measure, which will require an annual urine albumin-creatinine ratio (uACR) **and** estimated glomerular filtration rate (eGFR).
