Ordering Multiple Labs

Multiple pop-up windows can be a nuisance, but following a left-to-right workflow and using shortcuts can cut down on pop-ups and save time when ordering multiple labs.

1. Use the Ctrl key to select all the diagnoses you will be ordering for.

- Be sure to link the correct dx codes to the correct labs.
- Labs must meet medical necessity based insurance guidelines.

2. Enter the To Be Done date in the shortcut field. If you are a nurse or resident who always has the same preceptor, you can take advantage of Entering For and Supervised By shortcuts.

3. Search for and add labs.

Remember, always start on the left. You can select multiple diagnoses in the left column of the Add Clinical Item box using the Ctrl key on your keyboard.
